Job Advertisements rise in April

The total number of jobs advertised in major metropolitan newspapers and on the internet rose by 3.5% in April to a weekly average of 228,445 per week. This follows a 1.9% rise in total advertisements recorded in March. The total number of advertisements in April was 27.0% higher than 12 months ago.

Looking at the different channels for advertising jobs, the number of job advertisements in major metropolitan **newspapers** declined by 1.3% in April to an average of 19,897 per week. This fall follows a 2.0% rise in March. Newspaper advertisements are now 0.8% higher than in April 2006.

The fall in newspaper job advertisements in April was driven by declines in Western Australia (-5.7%); Queensland (-4.8%); New South Wales (-3.5%); Tasmania (-2.7%); South Australia (-2.2%); and Victoria (-2.1%). These falls were partially offset by job advertisement increases in the two territories, the ACT (4.0%) and the Northern Territory (0.8%).

The number of **internet** job advertisements grew by 4.0% in April to an average of 208,548 per week. In trend terms, internet job advertisements are still growing solidly, and annual growth has picked up slightly over the past six months (29.4% in April).

ANZ Head of Australian Economics Tony Pearson said: "The Australian economy has entered 2007 with a great deal of momentum. The labour market has continued to tighten, and employers are increasingly being challenged by a lack of availability of suitable labour.

"The ANZ Job Advertisements trend composite index shows that total job advertisements continue to rise strongly. Normally this would point to a step up in the rate of growth in employment, but with the capacity of the labour market already tightly stretched, there is a risk this increased demand for labour could instead feed into higher wages. Such an outcome would be of concern to policy makers," Mr Pearson said.

(Note: For some of the newspapers surveyed, the ANZ Job Advertisements series counts the number of advertisement 'bookings'. Each 'booking' may contain multiple advertisements. In addition, the ANZ series counts classified advertisements only, and does not include display advertisements. For these reasons, it would be incorrect to draw any inference or correlation from the ANZ series regarding advertising volumes or revenues from employment advertising in the newspapers surveyed. The ANZ series is not intended to, and should not, be used to assess the financial performance of any of the newspapers included in it.)

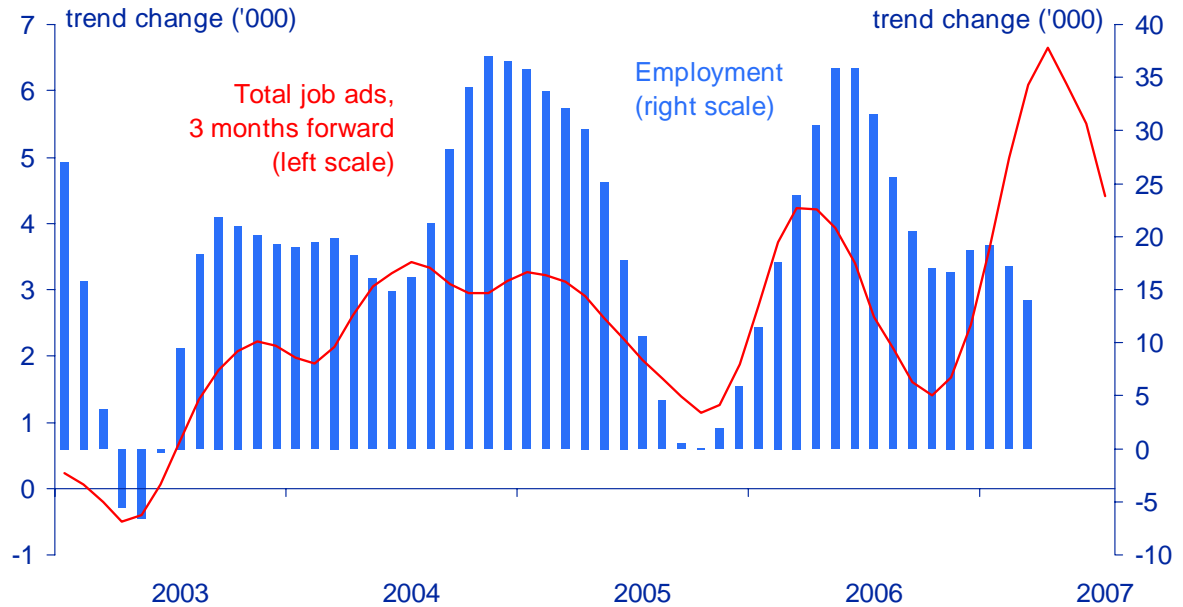

Monthly trend growth in total job advertisements and employment

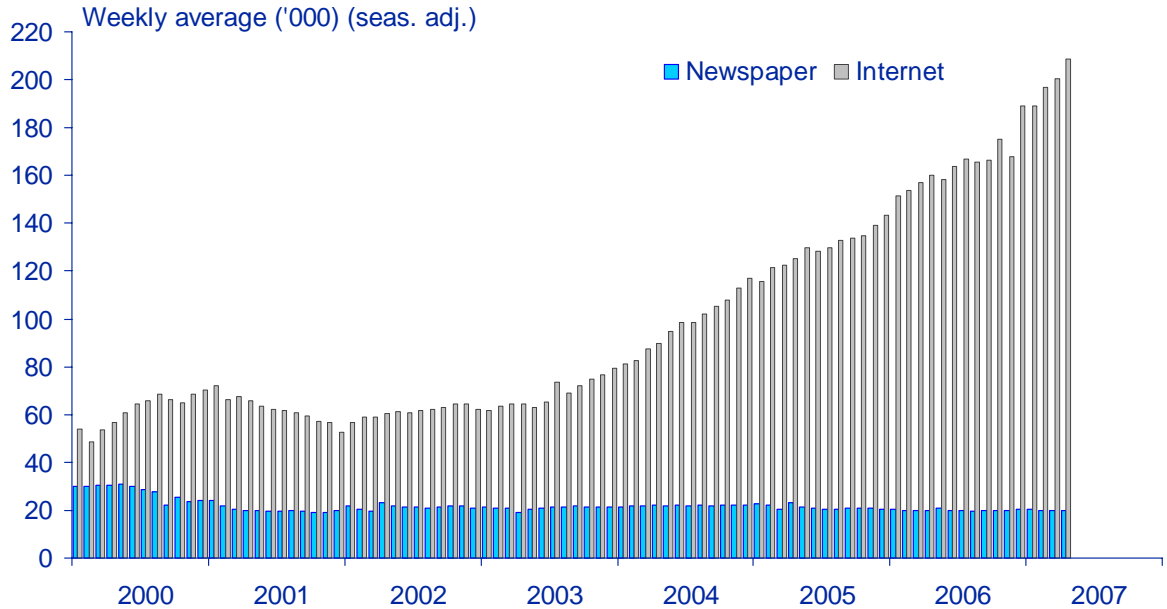

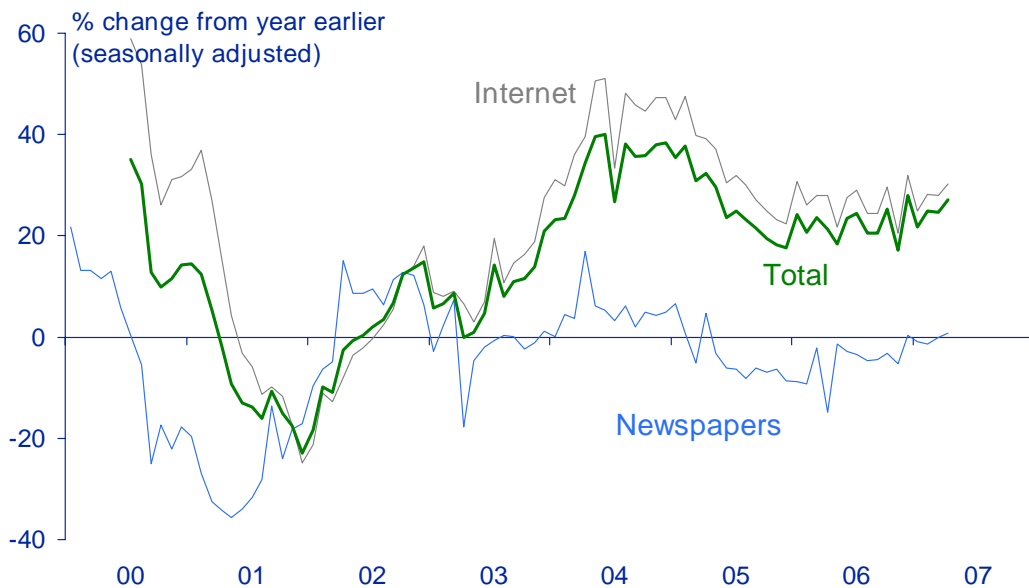

Annual changes in newspaper and internet job advertisements

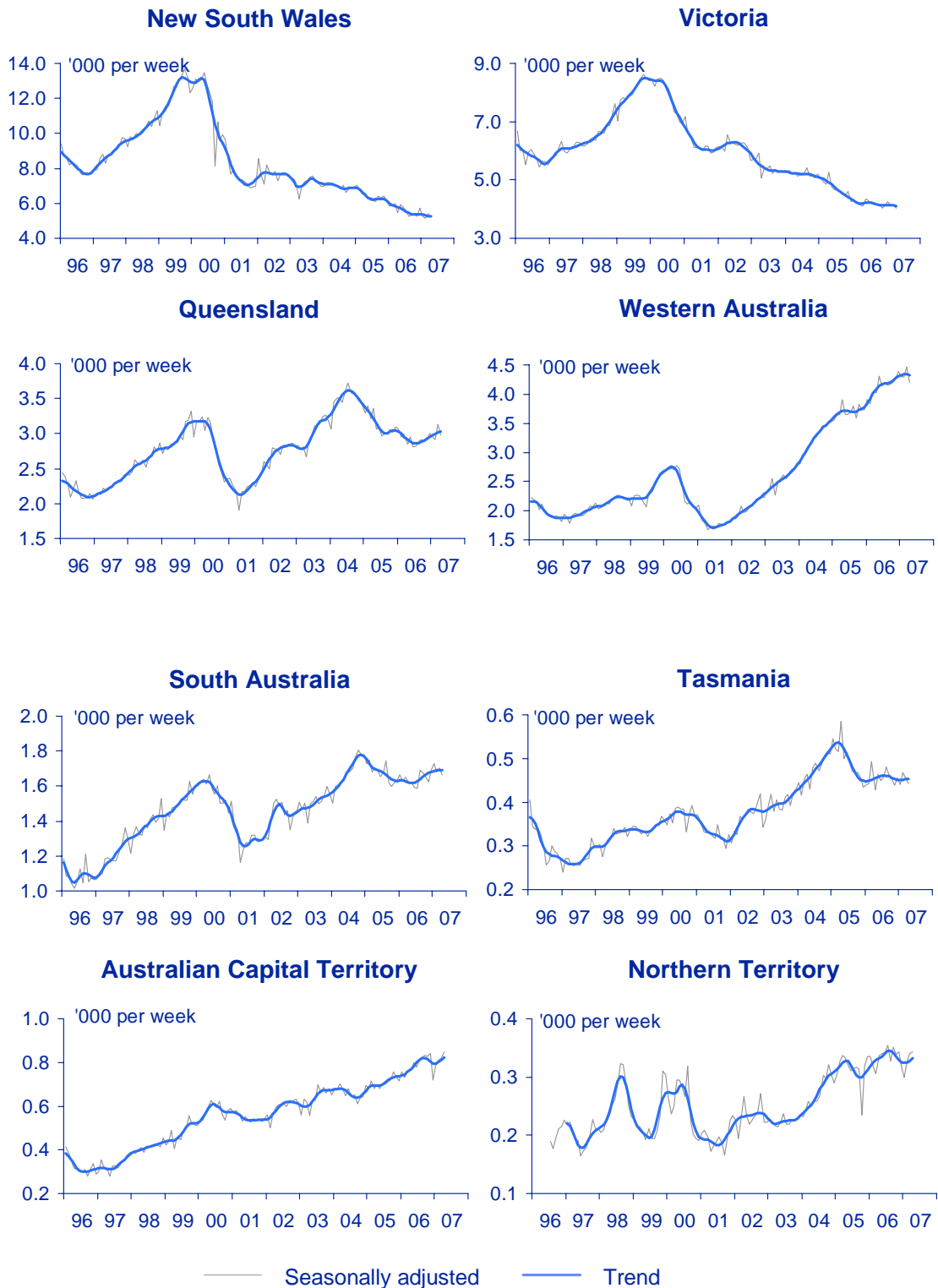
