Background

ANZ Trustees Limited (ANZ Trustees) is a statutory trustee company and is a wholly owned subsidiary of ANZ. ANZ Trustees is sole trustee or co-trustee of over 300 charitable foundations.

ANZ Trustees embraces its duty and obligation to honour the wishes of benefactors. Where ANZ Trustees has been entrusted to exercise sole discretion and judgement in grantmaking it has grouped smaller charitable trusts with similar purposes together and developed a series of grant programs, collectively known as ANZ Trustees Grant Programs. The Programs enable ANZ Trustees to offer more meaningful grants to charitable purposes and to increase the effectiveness of individual charitable foundations.

Types of projects ANZ Trustees Grant Programs funds

The overall aim of ANZ Trustees Grant Programs is: "To achieve a sustained positive impact on community outcomes, by supporting projects and initiatives that make a difference and leave the funded organisations and communities stronger."

To achieve this aim, ANZ Trustees will consider applications relating to projects that show some or all of these characteristics:

- Aim to bring about change, particularly beyond the immediate project target group and/or organisation;
- Focus on prevention;
- Address identified needs;
- Fit within the organisation's strategic plan;
- Seek to produce tangible outcomes that benefit individuals or the community;
- Show how the project and/or its impacts will be sustained when philanthropic funding finishes;
- Have the potential to leverage additional funding;
- Show how results may be disseminated publicly and/or how projects or programs could be replicated elsewhere;
- Demonstrate collaboration internally and externally;
- Show capacity to evaluate the project and to learn from the findings;
- Build the capacity of the organisation;
- Have carefully prepared and realistic budgets.

To achieve this aim, the Trustees will generally favourably consider applications from organisations that:

- Focus on their clients and the benefits they can achieve for them;
- Demonstrate best practice and leadership in their field;
- Have a commitment to share knowledge gained with other organisations;
- Have appropriate management, governance and structures;
- Operate efficiently and effectively with the majority of funding allocated to services and knowledge generation.

In addition to a specific Program's guidelines, consider the information above when making an application to an ANZ Trustees Grant Program.

Projects not funded by ANZ Trustees Programs

Philanthropic funding is distinct from government or corporate funding. Philanthropic funds are a 'gift' from a benefactor who wishes to give towards specific areas for public good. In the case of funding for ANZ Trustees Programs, it is distinct because it offers encouragement for development projects or new ideas while also supporting excellence, often prior to government or corporate funding.

ANZ Trustees Grant Programs do not fund:

- Projects that do not fit the aims of the specific Program;
- Projects that may be more suited to corporate sponsorship or investment;
- Projects that may be more suited to government funding;
- Budget deficits;
- Projects seeking support after the loss of government funding;
- General operating and administrative expenses;
- General fund raising campaigns, e.g. annual appeals;
- Core programs funded from other sources;
- Bodies which are themselves grant-making agencies;
- Projects which are auspiced by an organisation not directly involved in delivering the project;
- Requests for contributions for the continuation of larger scale medical research projects;
- Bequest programs;
- Contribution to the corpus of another trust;
- Projects requiring retrospective funding;
- Sectarian or religious bodies where services are limited to their own members;
- Individuals.

Instructions on completing an application

The community need for charitable money is always greater than the funds available. Most of the ANZ Trustees Programs are competitive merit-based programs and awarded to projects that best match the grant guidelines and are likely to have the most positive social impact. All applications are reviewed by ANZ Trustees and the decision is final.

These are steps your organisation should take when applying for a grant from ANZ Trustees.

1. Read all material in these Grant Guidelines relating to the Program you wish to apply to.
2. For a fuller understanding of requirements, we recommend you read additional papers and background material provided on our website, "Grant writing tips" and our regular publication "Trustee Focus".
3. Prepare your application using the Grant Application Form. It is important that you submit the application cover sheet and the application checklist. Please supply all the information requested, including signatures and dates, and copies of all requested documentation and clearly label all attachments.
4. You must have the required tax status to be legally eligible for a grant. You must provide copies of documents that show that the Australian Tax Office (ATO) has endorsed your organisation as a Tax Concession Charity (formerly referred to as Income Tax Exempt Charity - ITEC), and Deductible Gift Recipient status (DGR) where required.
5. You must provide your ABN number.
6. Complete a separate application for each project for which you are seeking a grant.
7. Provide the original and the specified number of copies of all documentation.
8. Do not include any materials other than those specifically requested.
9. Sign and date all forms.
10. Enclose a copy of the completed checklist with your application. Successful grant recipients will be required to lodge a report at the conclusion of the grant detailing the achievements accomplished and evaluating the success of the activities for which funding was given. A progress report will also be required for multi-year projects.
11. ANZ Trustees encourages organisations to publicly acknowledge the support received from a charitable foundation. While this is not a factor in deciding whether your application will be successful, it would be helpful to know that you would be prepared to acknowledge the funding received and to follow the acknowledgement guidelines published on our website.
12. Mail or deliver two paper copies of the application to Philanthropy Partners, ANZ Trustees.

Closing dates

Closing times are 5pm on the closing date stated in the current grant guidelines; late applications will not be accepted. If the closing date falls on a weekend or Victorian public holiday, you may submit until 5pm on the following business day. Refer to our website for application outcome notification dates.

1. ANZ Trustees Program: Charitable Purposes in Victoria

Guidelines:

- To support disadvantaged families in the rearing and development of children;
- To build the capacity of community organisations to strengthen and support the needs of family and community; and
- To support community arts/cultural programs that enable disadvantaged families to engage with community and or services.

Special Conditions:

Three trusts in the ANZ Trustees Program for Charitable Purposes in Victoria have special conditions relating to the giving of grants. Applicants should take these special conditions into consideration when applying.

- Organisations with an affiliation with a Western Christian Church, excluding the Roman Catholic Church, but including Methodists, the Uniting Church, the Anglican Church, Seventh Day Adventists, the Mormons or the Jehovah's Witnesses may be eligible to receive a grant from the Harry Dicker Estate.
- Organisations established by, or under the management of a church or denomination may be eligible to receive a grant from the Otto and Elizabeth Schumacher Trust.
- Catholic welfare and/or Catholic relief agency organisations may be eligible to receive a grant from the VCF George Perry Fund.

Guidelines:

The Program provides seed funding for initiatives or organisations that aim:

- To assist a national strategic approach to an issue of need in the community.

Preferred initiatives will display the following characteristics:

- Defined timeliness, or 'ripeness' of conditions in the operating landscape of the project;
- New partnerships that wish to develop a new approach to difficult issues.
- Leverage potential, or clearly defined impact that extends beyond the target group;
- A contribution to knowledge and practice in the sector of operation.

The program will **not** give favourable consideration to initiatives that include:

- Expansion of an organisations program or service within or between State or Territories;
- Generic fundraising applications for established programs, activities or services.

Special Conditions:

Applicants do not need to submit a full application in the first instance; only front cover of the application form is required with the letter of inquiry.

1. Brief overview of the project. State the expected dates of commencement and completion.
2. Specify the location where the project will be conducted.
3. Define the aims of the project and how you will achieve these.
4. Define the target group that you wish to assist. Provide quantitative data if possible
5. Explain the need that is being addressed and why this is important. Provide quantitative data if possible.
6. Describe the specific outputs/deliverables the project intends to achieve.
7. Describe the wider impact you expect your project to achieve.
8. How and by whom will the effectiveness of this project be measured/evaluated?
9. How will this project be sustained after the grant funds have been expended?
10. How will the results of this project be disseminated and/or the lessons learnt shared?
11. Give evidence of your organisation's capability and expertise to deliver this project.
12. List the names and qualifications or experience of the individuals who will direct and manage the project, and state whether they are current staff or volunteers.
13. What other organisations are doing similar work and in what way does your project differ from the initiatives of these other organisations?
14. Provide an itemised project budget (income and expenditure) for each year of the project or activity.
15. List the trusts, foundations, corporations and other sources, including governments, from which you are seeking funding for this project.
16. Provide the names and contact details (including telephone and e-mail) of two referees.

B. Organisational information to be provided:

1. Give a brief description of the history and purpose of your organisation.
2. List the characteristics of the population that your organisation serves, for example, geographic location, socio-economic status, age etc.
3. Summarise the current programs and accomplishments of your organisation.
4. How many paid full-time, part-time and casual staff does the organisation employ? How many volunteers regularly assist?
5. Provide a copy of your most recent annual report, including a list of your board of directors. If no annual report is produced, please supply a list of directors only.
6. Provide a copy of the most recent financial statements, audited if available. These statements should reflect actual expenditures and funds received in the most recent financial year.
7. Provide a brief summary of all grants that your organisation has received from ANZ Trustees in the last three years.
8. Provide an approximate percentage breakdown of your organisation's main funding sources, including philanthropic donations.
9. You must provide copies of documents that show that the Australian Tax Office (ATO) has endorsed your organisation with the correct tax status for the program you wish to apply for. Refer to guidelines for specific tax requirements for each program.

Privacy Statement and Consents

This statement applies to ANZ Trustees Limited ABN 33 006 132 332 (**ANZ Trustees**), the other Trustees of the particular charitable trust, settlement or foundation (**Trust**) to which your grant application relates (together, **Trustees**) and advisors appointed by the Trustees or otherwise under the terms of the Trust to advise or assist the Trustees in considering your grant application.

Collection of personal information

In its application to ANZ Trustees for a grant, your organisation (the Applicant) gives ANZ Trustees contact details and other personal information about directors and other key personnel (individuals). In the future ANZ Trustees, its researchers and advisors may obtain other information about the individuals from the applicant, from any of them, or from other sources. We may collect 'sensitive information' but only when it is necessary for the purpose of the application. This is all "personal information".

Use of personal information

We use personal information for the primary purpose of assessing the applicant's application, and if it is successful, to provide a grant to the applicant.

We may also use personal information for our internal operations including accounting, record keeping, archiving, compliance monitoring and compliance with legislative and regulatory requirements.

Without some or all of your information, we might not be able to process your application.

If your application is not successful, we may hold personal information we collect in relation to the application for our records. If your application is successful, after the grant is completed we may hold personal information concerning the grant for our records.

Disclosure of Personal Information

We may disclose personal information for the purposes set out above, to people and organisations who carry out functions for us, for example our agents and our researchers, any person you authorise, your legal advisers, any party to whom we are authorised or required by law to disclose the Personal Information, and any party to whom the person whose personal information we hold authorises us to disclose it.

Data quality

We take reasonable steps to make sure that the personal information we collect, use and disclose is accurate complete and up to date.

Data security

We take reasonable steps to protect the personal information we hold from misuse and loss and from unauthorised access, modification or disclosure.

Access and correction to personal information

Subject to exceptions permitted by law, an individual may obtain access to the personal information we hold about them by contacting the Trustees at the address set out below. An access fee may apply. If we are informed by an individual that the personal information we hold about them is not accurate, complete or up to date, we will take reasonable steps to correct it.

Where we receive and keep personal information about an individual from another source, generally that person will have the same access to that information and it can only be used for the same purposes and shared with the same persons as the personal information that you give us. However, to the extent permitted by law, personal information that we receive from other sources will be kept confidential.

Informing Individuals

You must inform each individual of the contents of this statement and consent. By signing the application for a grant, you acknowledge you are aware of this statement and, on behalf of each individual, consent to sensitive information being collected if it is necessary for the purposes of the application.
