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Job Advertisements remain strong in June

The total number of jobs advertised in major metropolitan newspapers and on the internet eased marginally by 0.8% in June to an average of 249,915 per week. This follows a bumper 10.3% rise in total advertisements recorded in May. The total number of advertisements in June was 36.1% higher than 12 months ago.

Looking at the different channels for advertising jobs, the number of job advertisements in major metropolitan **newspapers** dropped by 3.1% in June to an average of 20,150 per week. This pull back follows a 4.5% rise in May. Newspaper advertisements are now 0.2% higher than in June 2006.

The decline in newspaper job advertisements in June was driven by falls in Western Australia (-6.1%); Victoria (-4.6%); Queensland (-3.5%); and South Australia (-0.1%). These falls were partially offset by job advertising rises in the Northern Territory (10.6%); the ACT (6.0%); Tasmania (1.5%) and New South Wales (0.8%).

The number of **internet** job advertisements fell slightly by 0.6% in June to an average of 229,765 per week. In trend terms, internet job advertisements are still growing solidly, and annual growth has picked up to 39.6% from 25.9% seven months ago.

“Job advertisements remained very strong in June. We had expected some easing following the exceptionally large increase in May, however the fall of 0.8% was inconsequential and showed that demand for labour remains at record highs,” ANZ Head of Australian Economics Tony Pearson said.

“Employment growth has been robust in 2007 and our Job Advertisements series suggests it will remain strong in the months ahead. The rate of unemployment is already down to a 32-year low of 4.2%. With demand for new workers continuing at a record pace, there is a good chance that the unemployment rate will fall further over coming months. We believe we may well see an unemployment rate with a “3” in front of it before the end of the year. This would be a pleasing outcome, but it would also mean policy makers will need to remain vigilant for any signs that the tightening labour market is placing upward pressure on wages growth,” Mr Pearson said.

(Note: For some of the newspapers surveyed, the ANZ Job Advertisements series counts the number of advertisement 'bookings'. Each 'booking' may contain multiple advertisements. In addition, the ANZ series counts classified advertisements only, and does not include display advertisements. For these reasons, it would be incorrect to draw any inference or correlation from the ANZ series regarding advertising volumes or revenues from employment advertising in the newspapers surveyed. The ANZ series is not intended to, and should not, be used to assess the financial performance of any of the newspapers included in it.)

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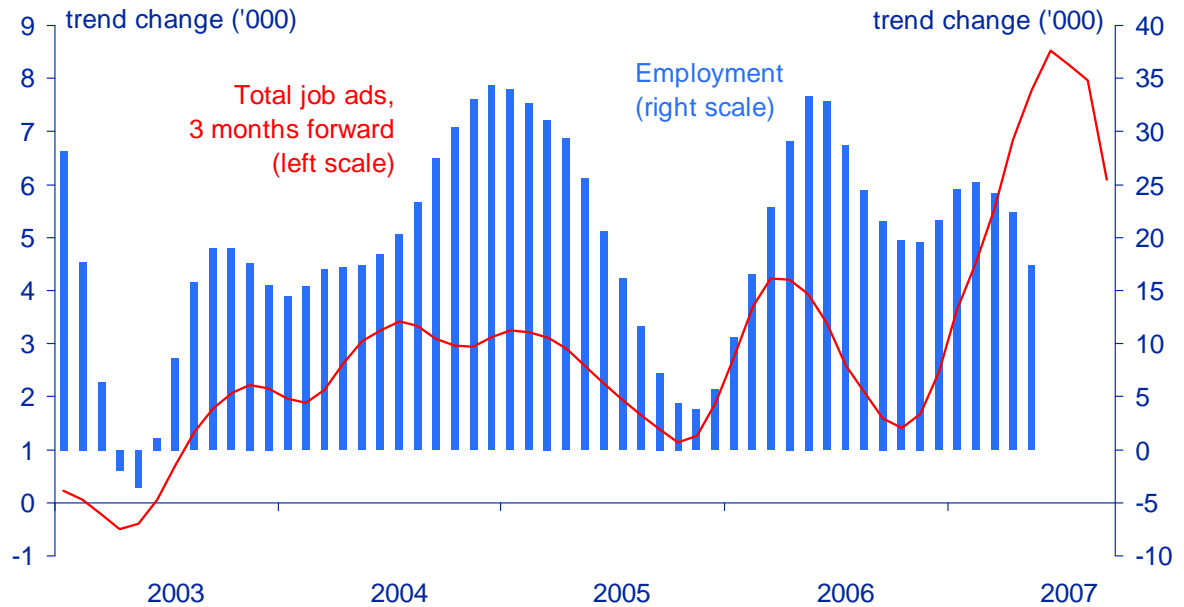

Monthly trend growth in total job advertisements and employment

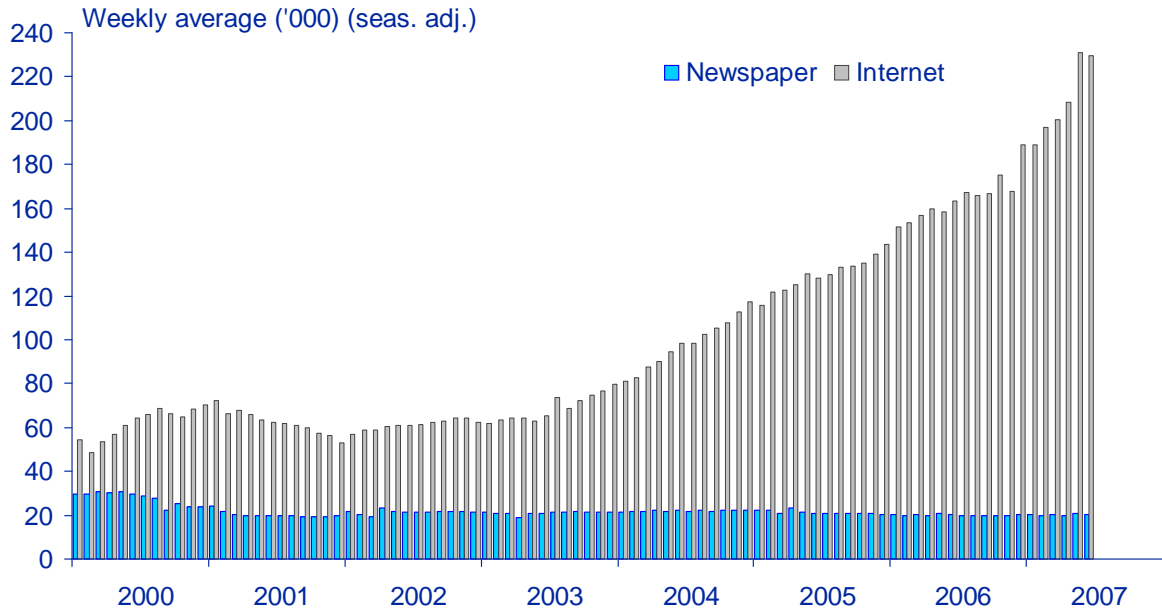

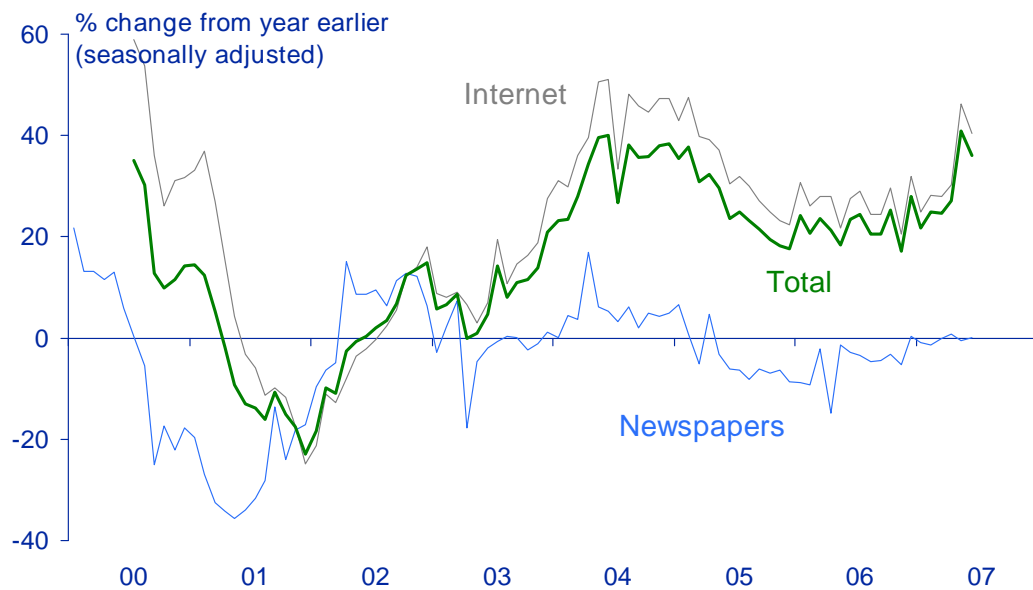

Annual changes in newspaper and internet job advertisements

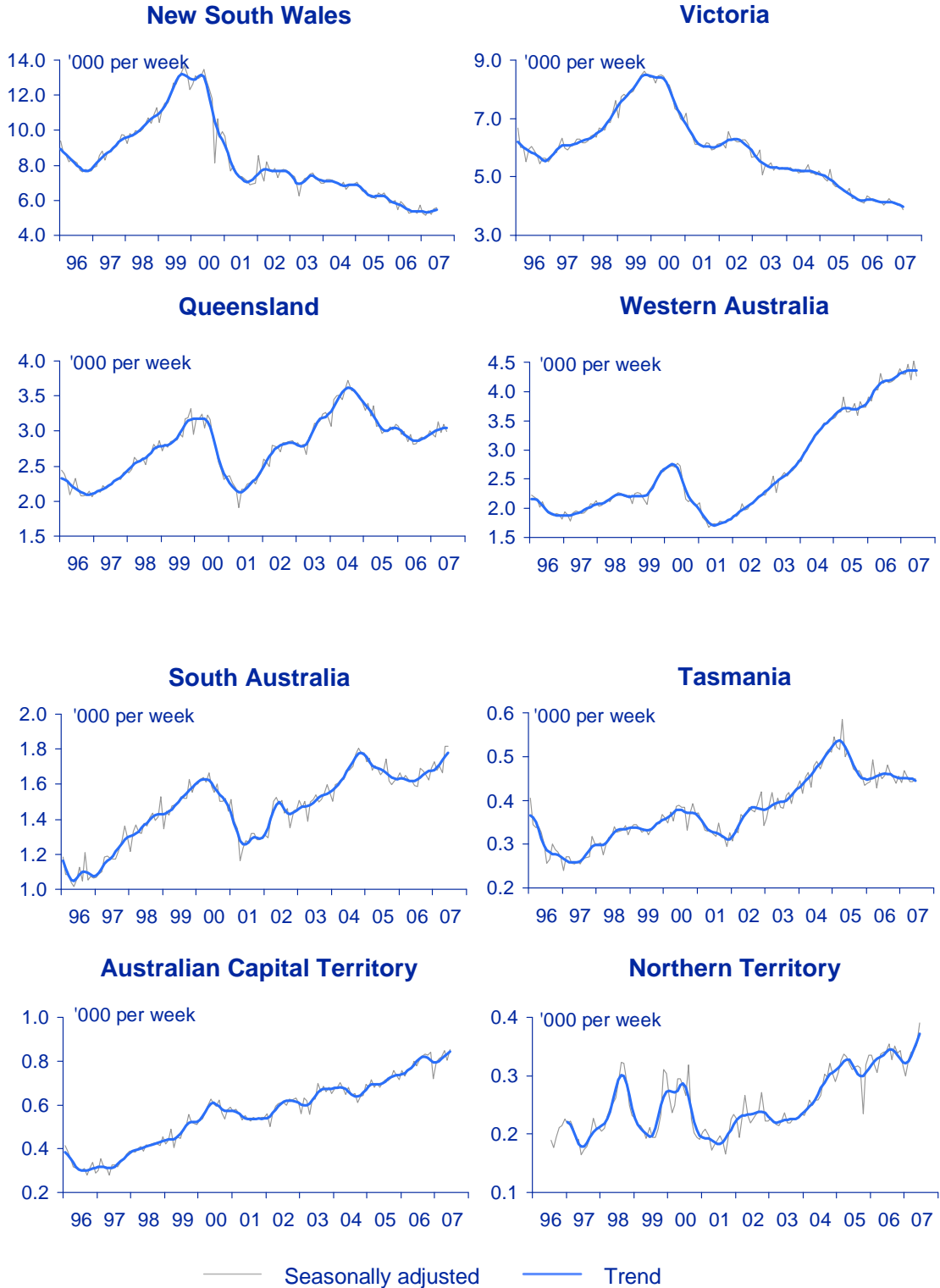
